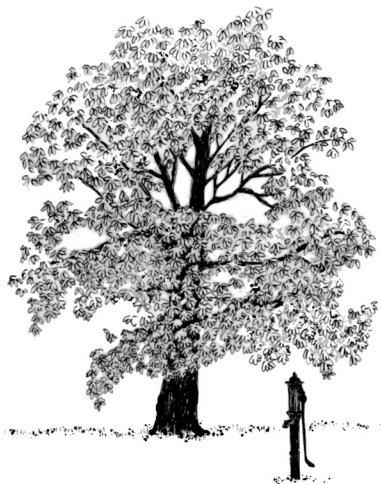

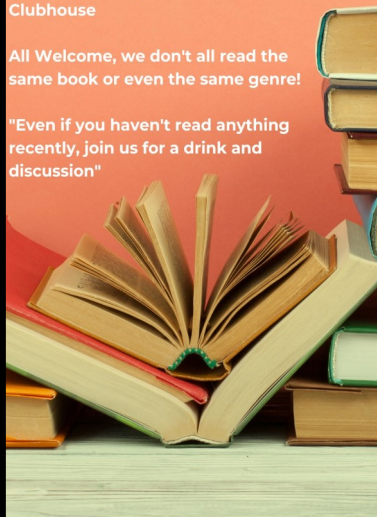

Instead of waiting for a collector to call, we hope this makes giving easier for everyone.

We have started early this year receiving donations on May 6th morning from those listening to the Madrigals. Christian Aid week itself starts on Sunday May 12th with our all-age service at St Nicholas Church at 10am where we will watch clips of the ways that the monies raised have helped some of the poorest and most vulnerable areas of the world. As usual coffee and biscuits will be served.

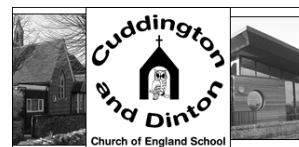
The Bernard Hall Annual General Meeting

THE VILLAGE PICTURE HOUSE CUDDINGTON

It's May already, and we have a varied selection of award-winning films for the next few weeks. On Thursday 9th May we'll be screening a new take on the beloved classic **The Color Purple** (cert. 12A), produced by Oprah Winfrey, Steven Spielberg and Quincy Jones. Torn apart from her sister and her children, Celie faces many hardships in life, including an abusive husband. But with support from a sultry singer named Shug Avery, as well as her stand-her-ground stepdaughter, Celie ultimately finds extraordinary strength in the unbreakable bonds of a new kind of sisterhood. "This take on the Pulitzer Prize-winner about the struggles of black women in the American South is a surprisingly fun jolt of musical joy," says *The Telegraph*. "This musical adaptation proves Alice Walker's novel can withstand endless cinematic reinvention," says *The Independent*. "An emotional roller-coaster I would happily, weepily ride again and again," says *WhatsOnStage*.

Then on 16th May we'll be showing **Titanic The Musical** (cert. PG). Recently revived and winner of five Tony Awards including Best Musical, this is a stunning and stirring production focussing on the real people aboard the most legendary ship in the world. Filmed for the big screen, this fabulous musical explores the hopes, dreams and aspirations of RMS Titanic's passengers who each boarded with their own stories and personal ambitions. "Sung with vigour and care, this disaster musical is a triumph. The day after seeing it I went back. It's that good," says *The Times*. "Breathtaking ... the best piece of musical staging in London," says *The Guardian*. "A heart-rendingly powerful production of a modern musical theatre masterpiece," says *The Stage*.

On 23rd May our film will be the eagerly anticipated **Wicked Little Letters** (cert. 15) starring Olivia Colman, Jessie Buckley and Timothy Spall. In 1920s Littlehampton, devout Christian and singleton Edith lives with her controlling father Edward and gentle mother Victoria. When Edith and fellow residents begin to receive wicked letters full of hilarious profanities, foul-mouthed Irish immigrant Rose is charged with the crime. However, as the town's women investigate the offence themselves, they suspect that something is amiss, and that Rose may not be the culprit after all... "This true tale of a foul-mouthed scribbler in 1920s Sussex is given nuance by a stellar cast ... gleefully swears," says *The Guardian*. "Olivia Colman hurling expletives is enough to sustain this witty true-life comedy," says *The Independent*. "Olivia Colman and Jessie Buckley have a f***ing blast," says *Vanity Fair*. On 30th May, we'll be screening the terrific period comedy **The Holdovers** (cert. 15). In 1970, a loathed classics teacher is forced to stay over at a prestigious New England boarding school during the Christmas break, to babysit a handful of students with nowhere to go. He forms an unlikely bond with a brainy but rebellious pupil, and with the school's head cook – a woman who has just lost her son in the Vietnam War.

This hilarious comedy won a BAFTA and an Oscar for Da'Vine Joy Randolph, playing the cook. "A trio of note-perfect performances ... charming," says *The Guardian*. "Hilarious and heartfelt, it's a tale to be treasured," says *Empire*. Looking ahead to June: on the 6th we'll be showing **Oppenheimer**, Christopher Nolan's multi-award-winning epic about the development of the atomic bomb.



On the 20th our film will be **Past Lives**, a spine-tingling romantic drama about two deeply connected childhood friends who are wrested apart but then reunited for one fateful week twenty years later. Finally, on the 27th, we'll be screening **Scraper**. This joyous drama is about a feisty 12-year-old girl who has been living alone in her London flat after her mother died, but then has to readjust when her estranged father returns.

Midnight Walk Weekend

Back by Popular Demand



Florence Nightingale Hospice Charity has brought back its Midnight Walk event as part of the Hospice's 35th anniversary, which will be hosted at Roman Park Hall, Aylesbury on Saturday 22nd June.

The Midnight Walk will also be accompanied by its two sister events as the Walk is evolving to become a whole weekend occasion. Twilight Walk and 'Not the Midnight Walk' are the new sister events.

All of these events are designed for friends and family to get together and celebrate the lives of loved ones and show appreciation for the Hospice which has supported the local community over the past 35 years. All in colourful and bright lights and clothing, lighting up the streets of Aylesbury.

The Twilight Walk is the first of the events to take place, in the evening (7:30pm) on the 22nd June. It's designed for under 15s and is a 2-mile route starting at Roman Park Hall.

The Midnight Walk is Florence Nightingale Hospice Charity's traditional event and has taken place numerous times since its inception in 2010. Taking place at Midnight on Saturday 22nd June, participants will receive free t-shirts and don bright lights and colours as they walk either the 5 or 10-mile Aylesbury route.

'Not the Midnight Walk' is an event for people who cannot attend on the 22nd but still want to support the Hospice and walk to show their appreciation and to remember loved ones. This event can take place anywhere and it is up to the participants to decide the location, time and duration of their walk. 'Not the Midnight Walk' can take place at any time on Sunday 23rd June.

With three events taking place over the whole weekend, the Midnight Walk has evolved for 2024. Lyn Denham, Community & Events Fundraising Manager, said

"With the Hospice celebrating its 35th anniversary this year, we wanted to share our excitement with the local community

and this event's growth is one of the prime examples.

It also provides maximum inclusion as people of all ages will be able to take part across the weekend. The community strongly supports Florence Nightingale Hospice Charity and the Midnight Walk has always been one of the best supported charity events in the Buckinghamshire calendar. With the inclusion of the remembrance lanterns, the memories of loved ones will once again be a powerful and visual reminder of what this event is all about."

Greener Cuddington

Let's Help Nature in Cuddington

Nature has become very depleted since WW2 through intensive agriculture, loss of natural mixed woodland, population growth, pollution of waterways and urban sprawl. The Environment Act 2021 introduced measures to turn this around through changes in agricultural subsidies, increased forest cover and 'biodiversity net gain' (BNG). Our country needs more housing to cope with the increased population (World population has grown from 3 billion to over 8 billion since 1950) and this, along with roads and industrial development, has always been at nature's cost. With BNG, developers have to compensate for this by paying for projects that replace the lost natural habitats and organisms plus a bit more. To make this happen and also to make sure the positive effects last, local communities are encouraged to become involved in creating and maintaining nature recovery projects. BNG is now implemented for new building projects and in our area, Bucks Council and the Bucks, Berks and Oxfordshire Wildlife Trust (BBOWT) have been working on building Local Nature Recovery Strategies. - Consider the impact on biodiversity of planning applications and how the design might be made to benefit nature.
- Where BNG impacts upon the Parish, ensure that accepted measures are carried out.
- Support initiatives to enhance biodiversity within the Parish.
- Manage its land in an environmentally friendly way.
- Promote improved biodiversity within the Council's business.

This is an opportunity to enhance our village and the local countryside, bringing bird song, wildflowers and hedgehogs back and protecting nature for the sake of our children and grandchildren.
